On July 1, 2019, the Foundation successfully concluded a \$2.5 million capital campaign to help Dr. Frank Laws and his team create the most sophisticated Heart & Vascular Center on the Western Slope!

Local philanthropists partnered with benefactors from as far away as Los Angeles, New York and Washington, D.C., to create something extraordinary at Valley View.

A program that began as a single cardiologist in the region's first cath lab in 2007 now boasts four cardiologists, a cardiothoracic surgeon and technology so advanced its manufacturer, Siemens HealthCare, chose Valley View to be its North American demonstration site. Moving forward, Dr. Laws and his team will continue to push the boundaries of what people think is possible for cardiac care in a rural area.

A good example of the innovations happening at Valley View is the laser ablation procedure. In March 2019, Dr. Laws and his team performed the first laser ablation procedure for atrial fibrillation (AFib) in the State of Colorado. "Right now," said Dr. Laws at the time, "we are ahead of most major urban medical centers who are going to get their lasers installed sometime later this year."

Of course, the reason for all this expertise and technology is simple. It provides Valley View's patients with the best possible heart care close to home. In the case of an emergency like a heart attack, time is tissue. It is imperative that life-saving interventions are available 24-hours a day and only minutes away. For nonemergency procedures, people no longer need to drive to Denver or Salt-Lake City for world class care. It's right here. Thank You!

Youth Recovery Center

Youth Recovery Center (YRC) at Valley View works to end the cycle of addiction in adolescent members of our communities by providing inpatient treatment and aftercare support services for adolescents age 15 to 18 in Colorado.

YRC serves up to **85 at-risk teens** each year in its **42 day treatment**. **2,179 adolescents** from across Colorado have benefited from the program since its **inception in 1987**. **80% of teens** will achieve and maintain sobriety or reduced substance abuse one year after treatment.

Valley View's Rehab Department offers Pelvic Floor Therapy

Through a scholarship fund partially funded through philanthropy, Valley View physical therapists are able to obtain advanced certifications in pelvic floor therapy, pain management, and other specialties.

Pelvic floor physical therapy is a specialty service providing treatment for conditions related to the muscles, nerves and tissues around the pelvis.

This type of physical therapy is on the forefront of patient care and requires special advanced training. Prior to the certification of Valley View physical therapists, patients needed to travel to Grand Junction or Denver to receive this type of rehab that can treat common conditions such as: urinary and fecal incontinence, pelvic organ prolapse, pregnancy pain, postpartum pain, menopause related weakness, and much more. The personalized one-onone therapy is designed to provide the highest level of care using the latest techniques to restore health and confidence, allowing one to get back to living life fully.

Helping Valley View While Saving on Your Taxes

With recent changes in the federal tax code, donors have seized the opportunity to make their charitable gifts directly from Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA).

If you are 70.5 years old or older, you can use a simple method to benefit Valley View and potentially receive tax benefits in return. You can direct up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as Valley View without having to pay income tax on that money. This increasingly popular gift option is called an IRA charitable rollover or a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This method can also be used to satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year.

If you have not yet taken your required minimum distribution for this year, the IRA charitable rollover gift can satisfy all or part of that requirement and potentially save you money on your taxes.

Because an IRA charitable rollover transfers funds directly from your IRA to a charity like Valley View, it does not add to your income for tax purposes.

Fighting Prostate Cancer with Cutting Edge Technology

Dr. Peter Rossi of the Calaway•Young Cancer Center recently completed the first ever prostate cancer treatment utilizing OrionTM, a medical device that uses MRI imaging to improve the accuracy of treatment.



"We are thrilled to be first to use Orion™ HDR MRI Markers in the treatment of a prostate cancer patient," said Dr. Rossi. "This kind of state-of-the-art care benefits our patients by supporting a treatment plan that is tailored to their anatomy. Effective treatment that minimizes the possibility of side effects is key as we

approach the care of our patients. We are proud to be a leader in adopting this kind of advanced treatment," Dr. Rossi added.

High Dose Rate (HDR) brachytherapy is a form of radiotherapy and a standard option for the curative treatment of many forms of cancer. It involves temporarily placing an applicator into the patient and then using medical imaging to identify the location in relation to the cancer and surrounding healthy tissue. A radioactive source is placed inside the applicator and irradiates the cancer before being removed. The popularity of HDR has increased in recent years due to its effectiveness and convenience.

The precise positioning of HDR applicators prior to treatment is critical for accurate delivery of therapy. Currently, this placement is usually guided by computed tomography (CT) imaging of metal wires that are temporarily placed inside the applicator. MRI can provide more anatomical detail than CT. The Orion[™] HDR Marker creates a well-defined, positive MRI signal and allows the superior anatomical imaging properties of MRI to be effectively utilized when planning treatment, offering the potential for effective treatment that minimizes the possibility of side effects.
