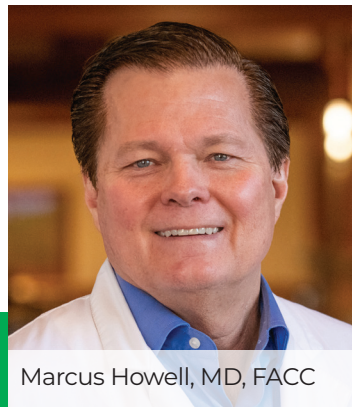
Advanced Cardiac Care

OCT Genuity Imaging System—Intravascular ultrasound (IVUS) and optical coherence tomography (OCT) are intravascular imaging technologies used in the cardiac catheterization laboratory. Currently, Valley View has the IVUS technology. The addition of OCT will expand options for providers to evaluate diseased heart tissue, adding another layer of precision for diagnosis and treatment. **Cost: \$135,000**

Biosense Webster Ripple Software—By creating dynamic 3D representations of electricity across the heart, this technology will support greater understanding of complex arrhythmias to enable more targeted treatments. **Cost: \$12,500**



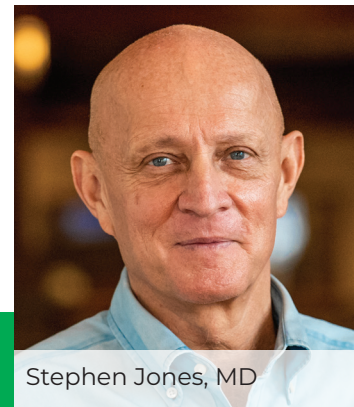

Urologic Care

Bladder Scanner—The addition of a bladder scanner in Acute Care will help meet the increased urologic needs of hospitalized patients and will prevent the need to “borrow” current equipment from other areas. **Cost: \$11,500**

Bio4K Camera Head—The addition of a Uro 4K camera head will allow the Urology team to address increased patient volume in the operating room, improving access to urologic surgical procedures and treatment plans. **Cost: \$21,000**

BioStorz Telepack and Camera Heads—This equipment is critical for scope-based urologic procedures, including evaluations of enlarged prostates, bladder cancer and general bladder health. Current equipment must be replaced this year. **Cost: \$38,300**

BioPorter Nitroniox Puls Nitrous Delivery Systems—Nitrous-oxide sedation is an alternative option for minor urologic procedures such as vasectomies and cystoscopies. This will give patients in the Rocky Mountain Urology Center the choice to undergo these services without experiencing the aftereffects of more robust anesthetics and prevent the requirement for a companion/driver to be present. **Cost: \$9,000**



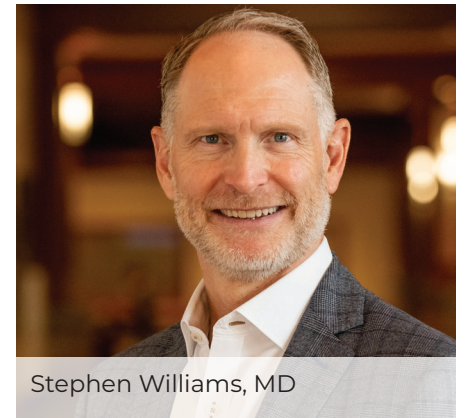

Giraffe Bed Warmer—The addition of this bed warmer to the Family Birthplace, the region’s only Level II Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), will make Valley View better poised to care for babies in need of elevated care. This equipment makes care possible with minimal disruption to the baby through ease of access for imaging equipment, interdepartmental transportation support, cross-contamination prevention through hands-free alarm control and height adjustability that makes it possible for both care providers and family members to be closer to the baby.

Cost: \$33,400



Breast and Skin Care

Stryker Surgical Light—This dual-headed light allows for enhanced visibility that is customizable to each patient undergoing minor surgical procedures in Mount Sopris Plastic Surgery Center. Because of the wide variety of procedures performed here, including chemotherapy port removal, skin cancer excisions and closures and certain breast health procedures, this advanced lighting system will bring a new level of surgical control to the plastic surgery team.

Cost: \$20,088

Cancer Care

Infusion chairs—These specialized chairs for patients receiving infusions at the Calaway•Young Cancer Center need to be replaced. The current chairs are 11 years old. Comfortable and supportive chairs are essential for patients who are often seated for extended periods of time during treatment. In addition to patient comfort, the new chairs prioritize the safety of patients.

Cost: \$22,021 for four chairs

The Critical Care Unit (CCU) at Valley View Hospital offers the highest level of intensive care among hospitals between Grand Junction and Denver. From cardiology to trauma to pediatric patients, this unit is essential to the care of our patients and the health of our community. With increasing patient volumes and rising complexity of patient needs, Valley View is renovating and expanding the CCU.

Cost: \$4.1 million
